

These simple people have blindly followed the lead of Veregin, and his every wish is a command. He wanted a harem and his followers supplied one. There are eighteen girls of tender age, such as are usualy seen in the schoolroom, in the harem. The Doukhobors are proud of the new institution, despite their moral principles.
