SLEDGES WERE USED

Chicago Police Continue to Raid Gambling Joints,

BATTER DOWN OAK DOORS

Raid O'Leary Pool Room. To Hours Consumed in Battering Down Doors. Paraphernalia Destroyed When Police Gain Entry. Quarry Had Flown.

Chicago, July 29.—After a day of activity against hand books and poker rooms, Chief of Police Collins' men last night attacked the pool room and gambling house of James O'Leary, at 4187-89 Halsted street. Telephones, a big telephone switch board and five poker tables were smashed and confiscated.

Entrance to the place was effected to the place after almost two hours of work by the policemen, who battered down five heavy oak doors and a dozen trap doors with sledge hammers and rams.

Earlier in the day gambling raids under Chief Collins' direction resulted in the arrest of forty men, keepers of poker rooms, hand bookmen, and the inmates of the resorts. To show that the "clean-up" is not desultory and for effect only, the chief's "flying squadron" went over the ground covered on Thursday and again raised two places that had been previously closed. The inspectors thought they were immune from further arrest when they pleaded guilty and paid their fines.

Seventeen keepers of gambling resorts and 35 inmates of the places were fined in the Harrison street police court. With one exception the keepers were fined \$25 and costs each, and the guests \$1 and costs.

CONFLICTING REPORTS.

Advices Say Disaffection in Argentina Is Now In Navy.

New York, July 29.—In view of the reported threats of an outbreak by revolutionists precautionary measures of the government have now been extended to the navy, cables the Buenos Ayres Argentine, correspondent of the Herald. All vessels are moored in the roads, preparatory for any emergency.

The radicals say that the alarm is without foundation and allege that it is fostered to prevent congress from voting amnesty for those in the army and in civil life who were engaged in the last revolution.

The "major" as he is known about the tracks, has gradually fallen from his high estate as a great handicap horse because of his unreliability and has recently been running in selling races.

STRIKE CALLED OFF.

New York, July 29.—A strike of house smiths and bridgemen who stopped work some weeks ago on the new East river bridge at Blackwell's island has been called off after a conference between Frank Buchanan, president of the union and officers of the Pennsylvania company. The strike here was in sympathy with one in the company's main plant at Harrisburg.

FOR IMMIGRANTS

Great Railroad Station to be Built at Ellis Avenue.

FACILITATES TRANSPORTATION

Large Railway Station Will Be Erected At Ellis Island Costing Two Hundred Thousand. Will Give Government Control of Immigrants.

New York, July 29.—To facilitate the transportation of immigrants admitted to this country by the authorities at Ellis Island, and to give the government absolute control of the immigrant from the time he arrives on the island until he reaches his destination, a big immigrant railroad station is to be erected off the western end of the island at a cost aggregating \$200,000. The station, according to the Tribune is to be built by the trunk lines interested with the steamship companies in the immigration business.

A few days after after his appointment Commissioner of immigration Watchorn says that he found that hundreds of immigrants who had received a clean bill of health at the island frequently were taken to piers up town and allowed to find their way to the stations for the West as best they could. Some of them wandered about the city, and complaints reached the commissioner from all parts of the country.

In some instances it is said to have been found that the treatment of the immigrants by minor officials of the carrying roads was little short of inhuman. The idea of a station on the island was the outgrowth of these reports and a meeting of expert engineers will be held in a few days to discuss the details.

WILL GET FORTUNE

Aged Man Proves Identity and Will Get Inheritance.

SAILS FOR HIS OLD HOME

James Travis After a Separation of Fifty years Goes to His Home in New Zealand and Will Get Inheritance of Thirty-five Thousand Dollars.

New York, July 29.—James Travis, 70 years old, will sail for his home in New Zealand today, having established his identity to the satisfaction of relatives whom he has not seen for more than fifty years. Travis came back here a few weeks ago seeking the recovery of an inheritance of \$35,000 which has been held by the state treasurer for about a quarter of a century.

It was only after a most thorough examination of his life story and a detailed account of his doings from the time of he was a child in this city and ran away to sea and later located in New Zealand, that Frank Hendrie, who was appointed referee to ascertain as to whether he was the man entitled to the fund, decided that he was and that his identity could not be questioned.

Upon this report Judge Giegerich, of the supreme court, yesterday signed an order directing the state treasurer to pay \$25,077 to Mr. Travis, less the costs of the proceedings.
