Advices received from Shanghai cancelling orders for Ghinese shipments from San Francisco present a serious phase of the Chinese boycott, which was generally accepted as a groundless threat. Reassuring comment has been received from time to time saying that the boycott found its inception among the hot headed student element and that the government and commercial guilds were not behind the movement. With business in Shanghai practically suspended, the closing of a branch of a prominent San Francisco export and import firm threatened and the demoralization of another project we can not look upon the boycott question with indifference. That the coolie element of China must not be admitted to this country is a recognized fact, at least on the Pacific coast, and while we intelligently appreciate this we should not advocate the enforcement of the exclusion laws to such extent that all Chinese shall be denied admittance to the country.
