Latest Quotations in the Portland Produce Markets.

Complete Market Reports Corrected Each Day Giving the Wholesale Prices of Commodities, Farm Produce and Vegetables.

Portland, Aug. 4.—Hog growers of the state are preparing to pick this year's crop in the fore part of September.

Scarcity still rules in the wholesale fruit market, and everything brings good prices. Peaches are notably scarce this year, and have thus far been considered too high for canning by housekeepers.

Poultry receipts have been heavy this week, while the demand for some reason, does not seem to keep up. Yesterday chickens were sold at 1 to 1 1/2 cents lower than market quotations, in order to get rid of them.

Lard has advanced from 3-8 cent on first grades to 1-2 cent on second class goods. The high price of hogs ruling the past month is said to be the cause of the advance.

Prices have been made on new crop oats and barley. In oats the figures are placed at \$22 for white and \$21 for gray, a ton. Barley is placed at \$19.
