knew as much about them as he did. After his death in 1901 the stockholders of the road met and unanimously elected her president. The roadbed of the little traffic way was wretchedly out of repair, and in spite of not being able to carry nearly all the freight offered to it a heavy debt hung over it, and for eighteen years it had paid no dividends. - President Kidder took hold of affairs energetically. She increased the carrying capacity of her road, got new cars and waked up things. She encouraged the development of the rich mines that lie along her line, the planting of great orchards, the stocking of new ranches. Now that crooked little road pays 10 per cent dividends and has no bonded debt. Mrs. Kidder herself owns a controlling interest in the stock and is not afraid to invest still further in it whenever any is for sale. All this a woman railroad president has done in four years honestly and fairly. The only crooked thing appertaining to this rallway is the road itself. Mrs. Kidder's home and office are in Grass Valley. She herself buys all supplies for her road.
