QUARANTINES LIVESTOCK.

Gov. Goodwin of Idana Puts Northwest Livestock Under Ban.

Boise, Idaho, Aug. 12.-Governor Goodwin has issued a quarantine proclamation against horses, cattle and sheep from the states of Utah, Nevada, Montana, Wyoming and Oregon. The govemor says in his proclamation that the state veterinary surgeon has informed him of the existence of mange and rabbies among the livestock of those states and on this account that animals being driven or coming into the state in any manner subject to an inspection by either a Federal or state inspector. The governor allows of a limit of two miles inside the state boundary for all livestock, except when they have been subjected to the dipping process which excludes them from the quarantine order. Horses and cattle under harness or yoke are also excepted.
