Physicians in Operating on Patients Neck Discover That His Heart is on the Right Side Nearly Six Inches From It's Proper Place.

Los Angeles, Cal., Aug. 21.-When Malcolm Rose, a landscape gardener. was placed on the operating table at the county hospital here today to under go an operation for the removal of a growth from his neck it was discovered by the surgeons that the left side of the body was located on the right side nearly six inches from its proper place.

The organ in every way, however appeared normal. It had evidently been in that position since birth. The physicians at the hospital state that it is the first case of the kind that has ever come under their observation.
