## Latest Quotations in the Portland Produce Markets.

Complete Market Reports Corrected Each Day Giving the Wholesale Prices of Commodities, Farm Produce and Vegetables.

Portland, Aug. 24.—Considerable wheat is being shipped to San Francisco this season, and the indications are that California will be a good patron of Oregon again.

Efforts are being made by the Produce Dealers' association of this city to induce the Southern Pacific to render quicker service in transporting tropical and citrus fruits.

Muskmelons have begun to reach the city from Dillard and other points in Southern Oregon. They sell readily at \$1.50 per crate of one dozen.

Oregon prunes have become plentiful at 50 cents per box.

Fresh eggs are considered firm at 22 1/2 cents per dozen. Eastern eggs are still very much in evidence in the market.

Butter has quit coming from San Francisco, on account of scarcity of fancy creamery there. Eastern butter is on the market to undersell the local product, which remains firm at quotations. Good apples are scarce. Wormy apples are not permitted in the market.
