Yellow Fever Discovered at Escatawpa.

QUARANTINE IS IMPOSED

Alabama State Board of Health Has Declared a Quarantine Against Numerous Counties in Mississippi Owing to Prevalence of Fever.

Mobile, Ala., Aug. 29.—The board of health has received notice of the discovery of four cases of yellow fever at Escatawpa, Miss., across the river from Moss Point and about 40 miles southwest of Mobile. On account of this information and the development of the fever at Natchez, Miss., the board held a meeting and authorized the institution of quarantine against the whole of the counties of Jackson, Harrison, Haycock and Adams in Mississippi.

FALLS INTO RIVER.

Woman Walks from Partly Opened Draw Into River.

Chicago, Aug. 29.—In sight of hundreds of passengers crowded about the rail of the steamer Eatland a woman walked from the partly swung bridge into the river at Wells street last night as the bridge moved back into place after the passing of the excursion boat. The efforts of a dozen willing life-savers who leaped from boat and docks into the river were futile as the victim failed to rise to the surface after the fall.

Descriptions of the woman given by the scores of witnesses who saw her walk from the bridge differ materially, but the police believe she was about 40 years of age and of matronly figure and aspect.

HAS NARROW ESCAPE.

Officer's Nerve Saves American Ship Being Captured by Japanese.

Seattle, Wash., Aug. 29.—The steamship Centennial reached port last night after a voyage to the mouth of the Amur river, for which place she sailed from San Francisco June 12. The officers say the fog and their captain's nerve saved them from capture by Japanese.

Under command of Captain Strand the Centennial sailed from San Francisco with a cargo, the principal part of which was salt, although she carried some flour. It is understood by the ship's officers that she was under charter to a man named Louri, who claimed that he was taking the cargo to a cannery, which he owned at Nikolaiefsk, which is some distance from the mouth of the Amur.

The Centennial dropped anchor 50 miles off Nikolaiefsk. Here she was obliged to wait for 19 days before she could discharge her cargo and get away. Although the cargo of the Centennial was said to have been shipped by a private party, the fact that work of discharging was done by Russian soldiers caused the officers and crew to have suspicions as to whether or not it was for private use.

NEW RAILROAD DEAL.

Stockholders Vote to Merge Harriman and Central Pacific Lines.

San Francisco, Aug. 29.—The stockholders of the South Pacific Railroad company, represented mainly by proxies at a meeting in this city have voted their approval to the recent merger of the Southern Pacific Railroad company of California with the South Pacific Railroad companies of Arizona and New Mexico. Following this action the stockholders voted to increase the capital stock of the corporation to \$100,000,000 and to issue bonds for that amount to meet requirements of the merger and the refunding of old bonds. The merger includes all the Harriman lines between San Francisco and El Paso excepting the Southern Pacific coast road between San Francisco and Santa Cruz, and the Central Pacific line in California which extends from Lathrop to Goshen and includes the ferry system between this city and Alameda County.

BANK CLERK CAPTURED.

Man Who Defrauded Paris Bank Is Captured in Brazil.

New York, Aug. 29.—Gallay, the Paris bank clerk who fled recently with an actress on board a chartered steam yacht and was arrested in Brazil, has confessed that he defrauded his employers, according to a Herald dispatch from Bahia.

Gallay at first insisted that he was a native of Belgium and knew nothing of the \$200,000 embezzlement committed in Paris. He is said to have admitted committing the frauds by falsifying signatures.
