

AN UNUSUAL CASE

Michigan Farmer for 32 Years—
Now Without a Country.

REFUSED RE-ADMISSION

Had Visited Childhood Home and on His
Return Is Declared Not to Be a Citizen—Has Nearly Two Thousand Dollars and Has Voted for Presidents.

New York, Aug. 30.—August Albert, who says that he has voted for several presidents, including Theodore Roosevelt, arrived here on Sunday in the steamer from Hamburg, and admitting that he was not a citizen of the United States, but was a citizen of the state of Michigan, was sent to Ellis island and is likely to be sent back to Europe unless the officials at Washington interfere. Albert is 63 years of age and had been a farmer in Michigan for 32 years when he decided to visit his childhood home in Saxony. This was about a year ago. He was stunned by surprise when held up by the immigration officials and told that because of his age he was likely to be refused admission to America. Albert showed \$1,688.20 to prove that he was not likely to become a public charge. He was examined by the Ellis island physician, then taken before the special board of inquiry and examined in English, which he speaks well. He told some of the younger members of the board that he had voted for a president when they were little children. He admitted that he had no papers to prove his declaration, but said that it had been only necessary for him to declare his intention of becoming a citizen two and a half years prior to November 8, 1892, to become one in Michigan. The board declared he must go back to Europe but friends interceded and the matter has been placed before the department of labor and commerce. If the board is upheld Albert will be a man without a country as he was never a citizen of Saxony.

UNFIT TO GOVERN

Philippines Would Suffer if Left

AGITATORS DEVELOP FACT

This Is Consensus of Opinion Among
Congressmen Present at Conference of
Agitators in Favor of Self-government
