### IS INVENTOR

Demonstrates Working of Wireless Telephone.

APARATUS REMAINS SECRET

Seventeen-year-old Boy of San Francisco Invents Wireless Telephone Apparatus Through Which His Voice Is Heard for a Mile.

Chicago, Sept. 4 .- A dispatch to the Tribune from San Francisco says:

Francisco J. McCarthy, a 17-year-old San Francisco boy, seems to have demonstrated the application of wireless telegraphy to the telephone. Yesterday at Ocean Beach, on home-made instruments he was able to carry the words of a song for one mile, so that it was reheard distinctly at the other end of his circuit. For several months the boy has been working at his invention, on which he hopes to get a patent. His apparatus is a secret. In the basement of the Cliff House in front of his apparatus he sang a half dozen songs and new-papermen and others at his receiving station a full mile away heard the words as distinctly as if they came over an ordinary telephone wire.

FOOLISH TEST OF STRENGTH.

Lifts Ten-Pound Dumbells 9.000 Times in Succession,

Chicago, Sept. 4.-By raising two 10pound dumbbells 9,000 consecutive times Henry Leveson of this city broke the world's record in a trial yesterday. The test of endurance was witnessed by several hundred spectators.

Leveson's time for the new record was five hours and 41 minutes, and during the long grind his strength was kept up by nourishment given him at frequent intervals by an attendant. He finished comparatively fresh and made the last 1,000 lifts in 36 minutes. The former record was made in 1870 by Pennock of Philadelphia, who raised the weight 8,431 times. Pennock, however, lifted from the shoulders up, while Leveson, in the record just established . lifted from arm's length up and down. | • On March 8, 1898, Leveson accomplished 4,500 lifts in two hours and 49 minutes.


