

## PORTLAND MARKETS

Latest Quotations in the Portland Markets.

Complete Market Reports Corrected Each Day Giving the Wholesale Prices of Commodities, Farm Produce and Vegetables.

Portland, Sept. 11.—Portland wheat quotations are now on a par with those of Liverpool, but ships are difficult to obtain.

Both flour and millfeed keep up, however, as a rule, though some slight reduction has been made in flour by Valley millers.

Large-sized potatoes are in demand, but the market is overstocked with small ones. Growers of early potatoes have no desire to bring them in at this time, as prices do not suit them.

City-made creamery butter is so scarce that an advance from the present high price is talked of.

Local creamery is held at 30c per pound, wholesale and fancy creamery from the country at 27½c. Store and dairy butter sells well if not too stale.

Fresh salmon should have reached the city today from down the Columbia, as the open season began Saturday morning. There has been delay in loading the catch on inbound steamers, and no salmon will arrive until tomorrow.

Chickens may be higher this week than last, unless receipts should be unusually heavy.

Walla Walla onions arrived in large quantities, and are sold at such prices that importations from California have ceased. The Oregon crop is said to be short this year.
