Portland, Ore., Sept. 14.—Fancy creamery butter is considered weak on front street at 27 1/2c per pound, but up town creameries sell all they make at 32 1/2c.

Hop picking has been going on since the showers let up, and growers all agree that the rain did the hops good, as it washed the vines and laid the dust in the yards.

New cranberries, the first of the season, appeared on the market this morning from Yaquina bay. They are quoted at 89 per barrel, and sell readily.

Eastern and cold storage eggs have advanced in price as the result of the high figures demanded for fresh Oregon ranch.

Chickens have sold readily thus far this week, but prices do not advance from those of last.

Dressed veal of proper size is in good demand, but there are too many large carcasses coming in to sell well. Dressed pork is considered weak, also, though block hogs are placed among retail butchers without difficulty.

Pomegranates from Sacramento valley are on sale at \$1.25 per box. The demand is light.

"Pure White" flour has declined 20c per barrel, and is quoted at \$4.30.

A car of Pillsbury flour is being unloaded here. It is quoted at \$6.85@7.25 per barrel.

Rogue River melons and casabas are plentiful and the sell well, considering the lateness of the season.

Potato dealers report nothing doing, and prices weak from lack of export demand.

A fair supply of silverside salmon is in the market from the lower Columbia.

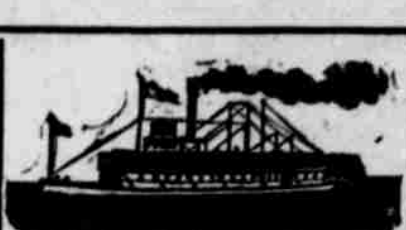
