IRON TRADE NOTES

No Doubt as to Heavy Winter Trade in all Lines.

BUSINESS EXCEEDINGLY GOOD

The Blast Furnace Production for August is Placed at 2,830,000 Tons—of which Steel Works Produced 1,186,000 Tons.

New York, Sept. 14.—The Iron Age in its issue of today says: A review of the whole iron industry justifies the general statement that it is enjoying great present activity and brilliant promise for the future.

It is expected that today negotiations will be closed for from 10,000 to 15,000 tons from the Bessemer Steel company.

It is also estimated that the leading interest will need between 35,000 and 40,000 tons per month of Bessemer pig during the balance of this year.

There are indications of renewed buying of basic pig iron by the eastern steel makers.

Some pretty large requirements for foundry iron are coming up from the Pittsburgh district, between 25,000 and 30,000 tons being referred to as the requirements of some large consumers.

Some of the leading smelters in the Chicago district are in the market in lots of 50,000 tons and under. Some business has been closed but on the whole the southern furnaces are not apparently pushing sales.

The estimating departments of the fabricators of structure material are extremely busy so that the prospect of a large volume of work is excellent.

The pressure for deliveries for material continues heavy. In the plate market there has been increasing activity in anticipation of an advance.

The trade in wire continues heavy. Prices which have been ruling for some time on the basis of \$1.70 per pound have been advanced to \$1.75.

CALIFORNIA MENACED.

Orange Orchards May be Destroyed by Maggots.

San Francisco, Sept. 14.—John Isaac, after acting as representative for California in a conference with the horticultural authorities of Mexico, has just reported that he has discovered that six and perhaps more states in Mexico are harboring a foe of oranges which there is reason to dread if it should be permitted to enter California.

He reports that he found that thousands of oranges and mangoes have been destroyed by the Mexicans in an attempt to eradicate the orange maggot, which has occasioned much damage.

STRIKE IS AVERTED

Building Trade Unions Agree to Arbitrate Grievances.

75,000 MEN ARE AFFECTED

Sheet and Metal Workers Would Have Been Locked Out and a New Organization Formed Had They Not Agreed to Arbitrate.

New York, Sept. 14.—A big strike in the building trades was averted yesterday when the sheet and metal workers announced through their representatives that they would report back for work today.

There is an arbitration agreement between the 75,000 workers in the building trades and the 1,000 employees, the sheet and metal workers being among the number.

Twice the employers ordered them to return to work but each time the metal workers defied them. The board of governors of the building trades employers met yesterday to take final action which would have meant the locking out of the metal workers and the formation of a new organization.

VESUVIUS STILL ACTIVE.

Semaophore Stations Near Stromboli Have Collapsed.

New York, Sept. 14.—The Herald's European edition publishing the following from the correspondent at Naples:

The eruption of Mount Vesuvius continues as in the last days, but without tending to any increase. On the other hand according to a telegram to the Mattino, Stromboli is causing great alarm, its crater vomiting a high pillar of fire and dense smoke accompanied by loud noises.

The ground presents numerous cavasses and many houses have been abandoned. The custom house and semaphore stations have collapsed.

PROHIBITIVE TARIFF

Argentine Shuts out American Farming Machinery.

EXPORTERS ARE EXCITED

More Than a Thousand Cars of Farming Machinery is Yearly Shipped—Action Means Heavy Loss to American Manufacturers.

New York, Sept. 14.—Cablegrams from Argentina, were received yesterday by the leading exporters in New York saying that the government had given notice that it was to levy a prohibitive tariff to Morocco on all parts of agricultural and industrial machinery used in repairing and calling on American manufacturers to ask the American government to intervene.

A representative of the American exporters said yesterday: "This news is so sudden we hardly know which way to turn. We do not even know if Argentina is to apply the prohibitive tariff to European and Australian exports, although we believe not. We will ask Secretary Root to direct the American minister at Buenos Ayres to intervene."

"If this prohibitive tariff goes into effect it will be a heavy blow to American manufacturers. More than a thousand carloads of machinery are shipped every year from this country to Argentina, but there is little profit in the trade. The profitable end of the business is in the export to Argentina of spare parts used for repairing on which the duty has averaged less than 25 per cent of that levied on machinery proper."

It will be a day or two before we find out if we can stop the new tariff or ascertain the motive of Argentina. She had practically no coal, iron or wood, except dye woods, so there is no opportunity for Argentina to build factories to compete with foreign makers of machinery. There must be some trick behind the move."

FOREIGN RESIDENTS GUARDED.

Moroccan Government Stations Troops in Tangiers.

New York, Sept. 14.—Replying to a collective note addressed to the foreign legations the Moroccan minister of foreign affairs has notified the representatives of certain powers that a detachment of 1000 soldiers stationed two days distant from Tangier has been ordered to transfer its camp to the environs of Tangier, says a cable dispatch from that city to the Herald. As a further precaution, the Tangier garrison of trained troops is being supplied with new modern armament and a corps of Soudan infantry will be distributed as a reserve guard along the thoroughfares leading to the town. These steps are directed toward the establishment of personal security, menaced by recent events in the diplomatic capital of Morocco.
