Complete Market Reports Corrected Each Day Giving the Wholesale Prices of Commodities, Farm Produce and Vegetables.

Portland, Oct. 2.—"Oregon hops are the only first quality hops raised in the world this year," said E. J. Smith, of Oneida, N. Y., today, "and they should bring top prices. Saturday a sale of 200 bales of choice Oregon hops was made at 12 1/2 cents, and the New York man who bought them is in the market for 500 bales more.

Growers are not anxious to sell, however, and I look for a decided advance before many Oregon hops have changed hands.

Contract hops have begun leaving the city for the east in large quantities, and their condition is such that buyers have no fault to find with them, although contracts have run as high as 15 @ 18c per pound. It is said that nearly all the Oregon crop of 1905 is now in bale, and that the hop harvest of the state is virtually over.

The prospects of high prices for wool next spring keep sheep raisers from shipping many wethers to market, and so mutton prices are likely to go up rather than decline. When 25 cents per pound is assured for wool it will pay to keep sheep over winter, even though ranges should be crowded.

Good cows are in demand, but poor, or "half fat," are of dull sale. The same may be said in reference to the calf market.

Tomatoes are held at good prices on Front street, though they are in heavy receipt. The demand for canning is heavy at this time.

Quinces have appeared in the market in large numbers. They sell at \$1 per box.

Potatoes are of dull sale, as there is no export demand.

Butter is plentiful and prices weak, both up town and on Front street.

Peaches are scarce and the market is firm.
