Portland, Oregon, October, 19.—More activity is now displayed in the wheat markets of the northwest and considerable buying is being done by Portland exporters.

It is said, however, that little wheat or flour has been ordered for Chinese ports on account of the boycott on American goods.

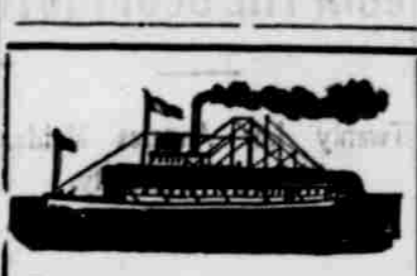
