Complete Market Reports Corrected Each Day Giving the Wholesale Prices of Commodities, Farm Produce and Vegetables.

Portland, Oct. 20.—Comparative quiet continues to prevail in the wholesale fruit districts of Portland, and dealers are inclined to become alarmed over the prospects. Little or no demand appears for what fruit comes in, and prices of all kinds, except apples, are inclined to drop in order that stocks may be moved before decay sets in.

In the meantime, large quantities of grapes, the last of the season, are piling up in the warehouses, with little or no demand. Prices on grapes were marked down materially this morning in order that a proportion of those coming in might be moved immediately.
