An estimate of \$75,000 is made for improvements in the Yellowstone National Park, Expenditures on rivers and harbors improvements in the United States reach \$22,328,623 . This does not include \$2,265,073 under the Mississippi river Commission. No estimates are made this year for river and harbor improvements save those provided for under continuing contracts. This amounts to \$17,456,801, to which is added \$15,000 to be expended under the California Debris Commission and also an estimate of \$2,000,000 for the Mississippi River Commission.
