**October Report of Master Warden Van Dusen.**

**INTERESTING FACTS SHOWN**

**Egg Totals from All the Hatcheries—Offenses, Fines and Forfeitures in Connection With the Fishing Laws—Money's Received and Disbursed.**

From the monthly report of Master Fish Warden H. G. Van Dusen, for the month of October, 1905, just filed with the State Board of Fish Commissioners, the following facts are gleaned:

In District No. 1, two cases of operating traps without license have been brought and prosecuted and both offenders punished by fines: In District No. 2, four cases were disposed of with similar results.

From reports received from all sources the collection of Chinook eggs on streams tributary to the Columbia river this season has been 39,165,900, as per the following:

**VERDICT OF SUICIDE**

**Coroner Holds Inquest Over Daniel Piekari.**

Yesterday afternoon at 3 o'clock a jury of inquest, summoned by County Coroner W. C. Pohl, convened at that officers undertaking establishment, to review the circumstances attendant upon the death of Daniel Piekari, the Finn found dead in the southern suburbs yesterday.

The jury consisted of the following citizens: James Finlayson, William Kelley, C. W. Stone, Max Stral, Henry Butman and William McCrosky. There being no witnesses to the shooting, the jury had to rely upon extraneous circumstances and testimony, all of which led inevitably to the sole conclusion of suicide.

One phase of the evidence was of a sort to greatly simplify the inquiry, and that was the finding of five letters written by the dead man and left among his effects at the place he boarded and roomed, at the house of Gabriel Thompson at No. 3 West Astor street to whom one of the letters was sealed and addressed to Mr. Thompson. Its contents were plainly indicative of his purpose to kill himself and was written a day or two before the act. The other four were of the same tenor, but were unaddressed. These, with such other items of direct information as bore on the situation, warranted the jury in the verdict it returned in favor of self-murder.

The unfortunate man had subsisted upon \$1200 he received for a timber claim some four years ago, and when his funds became exhausted, he became so used to idleness, he sought to live without work, and this was augmented by a disease of the eyes that put him up against the real thing and he could not stay.
