Chaban Boy Banished From

SULTAN SETS PRICE ON HEAD

Suffers Confiscation of His Estate and Other Forms of Persecution Because of Revolutionary Ideas Propounded-Working for Foreign Missions.

Boston, Nov. 14.—Banished from Albania after his estates had been confiscated, Chaban Bey, on whose head the Sultan of Turkey has set a price, was one of the passengers on the White Star liner Canopie, which arrived from Mediterranean ports vesterday. He has come to this city in the interest of the American Board of Foreign Missions to try to raise funds for a boys school in Albania.

Mr. Bey said that the Turks had closed all the schools in Albania, with the exception of two missionary schools for girls which, he says, they do not dare close. He declares that his banishment from Turkey was caused by the revolutionary ideas propounded by him.


