Portland, Nov. 17.-No wholesale dealer cares to commit himself on the turkey situation this Thanksgiving. A few coops of live turkeys and a considerable number of dressed ones have reached the city for the Thanksgiving trade, but it is considered rather early yet, and the sales made are fey. It is understood in some quarters that the turkey supply of San Francisco and Seattle will be large enough without importations from Oregon, and so the turkey raisers of the state are likely to send the bulk of their product to Portland this time. Some uptown retailers are offering 19@19e to farmers for fat live turkeys to be sent in Thanksgiving week, and a good many birds will probably be shipped direct to these retailers.

Onion growers who have best qualities on hand refuse to sell them at present offerings, and only second-class onions can be had in large quantity. These inferior onions were injured by the rains and frosts of fall, after they had been pulled, and they will not keep so well as those that were cured in first class condition. As usual, producers hesitate to sell on a rising market, as they desire to take advantage of the expected increase in values.
