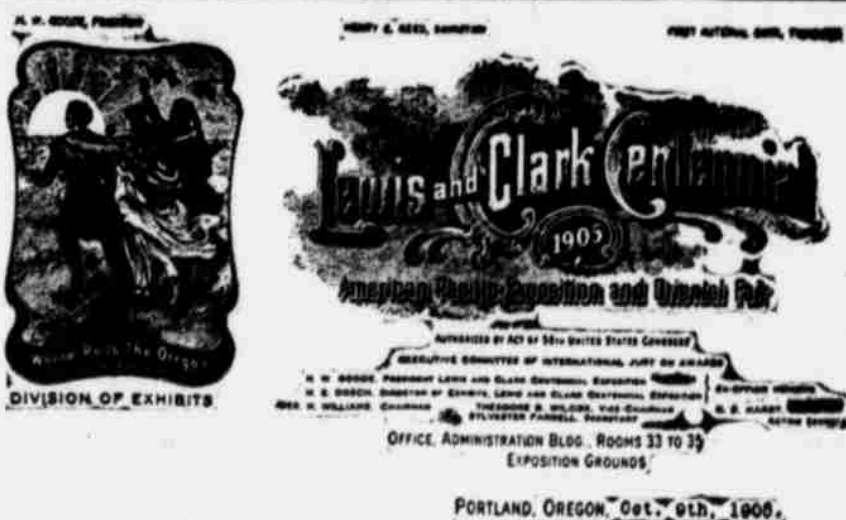
TWO GOLD MEDALS
