## PORTLAND MARKETS

### Latest Quotations in the Portland Markets.

Complete Market Reports Corrected Each Day Giving the Wholesale Prices of Commodities, Farm Produce and Vegetables.

Portland, Dec. 6.—Between two-thirds and three-fourths of the wheat crop of the Northwest has already been sold this year, according to leading exporters, who expect that sales hereafter will be inclined to drag. "Those having wheat on hand at this time are not anxious to sell," an exporting firm reported today, "and we must now busy ourselves in shipping out what we have bought. There are about ten ships now in the harbor awaiting cargoes for the United Kingdom, but loading of these will be retarded somewhat on account of lack of cars to carry to wheat from the interior to Portland. Car service is better than it was, but still we need a great many more cars than seem to be available."

San Francisco buyers are not trying to do much purchasing now, as dealers in California are waiting to see how the crop of that state is likely to turn out. Should bounteous rains fall in the Sacramento and San Joaquin valleys this month, California would discontinue her purchases in Oregon, and next fall would have considerable wheat to see herself.
