Latest Quotations in the Portland Markets.

Complete Market Reports Corrected Each Day Giving the Wholesale Prices of Commodities, Farm Produce and Vegetables.

Portland, Dec. 13.—An advance in fancy creamery butter of 2 1-2c per pound has taken place as a result of unfavorable weather on the dairies of the Northwest, which has reduced the milk supply. Butter has been firm for the past two weeks on account of good demand for the fresh article, but as there was a good deal of eastern cold storage product on hand, prices were kept stationary. The shortage of cream from the adjacent to Portland now limits the supply of local creameries, which have accordingly led off in starting the advance, which was followed by the front street commission houses. Unless mild weather should come, fancy creamery butter of local manufacture is likely to be kept at the present figures all winter.

Dealers do not expect much fancy creamery butter from California this year, as prices are so close together in both states that importation would not pay.

A good demand exists for small calves, but prices have not advanced. Japanese oranges are on the market at 1.25 per case.

Lemons are more plentiful and prices incline to weakness.
