HONOLULU, Jan. 5-Simon Wharton vas found dead in a canefield at Waialula on the Island of Oahu, He was murdered in an atrocious manner His legs, arms, and head were severed from the body, the tongue cut off, and eyes gouged out. FAVORS PHILIPPINE TRAFFIC

Representative from Missouri Ascribes Future Greatness of Republican Loaders to "Stand Pat" Policy-Is Interrupted, Many Times by Opponents.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 5 .- "Champ Clark Democracy" which was expounded to the delight and entertainment of the house for three hours today by Clark, of Missouri, constituted the feature of the debate on the Philippine tariff bill. Clark's speech took a wide range. He labelled his political beliefs as above, in answer to the question as to what kind of a Democrat he really was. He talked that the Philippines favored the pending bill, and discussed the general turiff question and in particular the German tariff situation.
