Purported Output of New Plant Under Way at Seattle.

The Post-Intelligencer of Scattle, under Saturday's date is responsible for the following bit of news, of decided interest to the fishers and packers of the northwest;

the San Juan Fishing Company on Stacy street for the erection of a fish curing plant that will have an annual output of 50,000,000 pounds of fish.

"It is the intention of the company, to cure fish in all the different ways, as well as to ship fresh fish to the east in refrigerator cars. When completed, the new factory will represent an expenditure of between \$75,000 and \$100.

"The location purchased is on tSacy street, near Whatcom avenue, and work on the plant has been delayed until some de'nite action is taken by the city on the different railway franchise applications that have been made on that thoroughfare.

"With the plant that we propose to establish, good railroad facilities is an actual necessity," said F. A. Twichell, manager of the cannery department of the company and a heavy stockholder in the institution, "and the San Juan Fishing Company wants to see all of the roads granted equal privileges on

"In 1905 we shipped 5,000,000 pounds of fish over the Great Northern railway in refrigerator express cars. The freight and express charges for the year were over \$300,000.

"'With a plant having a capacity ten times greater than the output of last year, the freight and express charges that the company will pay in the next year is an item worthy of note, and the company very naturally desires to have all of the shipping facilities that it is possible to secure for the future,

"'The market is increasing each year. and during the last senson the San Juan Fishing Company placed halibut from this coast in direct competition with the halibut of the Atlantic, with good success. It is the intention of the company to develop other of the natural fisheries resources of the Pacific Coast, and all kinds of fish that are taken in these waters will be handled when the new plant is completed. The company will also require several new steamers, and these will be built in Seattle during the present year."
