Portland, Jan 7.—Dealers in California fruits and vegetables expect an advance in price along several lines as a result of recent frosts in the groves and gardens of that State.

Portland is mainly dependent on the California coast counties for green vegetables, and a shipment by steamer unloaded here this morning shows more or less injury as a result of cold nights.

"It is not likely that a single bale of hops will be carried over until next hop harvest in Oregon," one dealer said today, "as growers are all eager to be rid of what they have. This is a queer condition of affairs, compared to this time last year, when hops were worth three times what they are now, and many growers and dealers were determined to hold on for still higher prices."

"The cleaning up of last year's crop will have a good effect on this year's prices, as there will be no old hops in the way of the new, as there was last September."
