A STATE OF SIEGE

Bogota Declared to Be in State of Siege for Few Days.

ARRESTED CUNSPIRATORS

Government is Declared to be in Perfect Control of the Situation and Will Try the Three Conspirators in Short Time.

NEW YORK, Jan. 20.-Louis E. Bo nilla, consul-general at New York for the United States of Cohmbia, today made public the following cable dispatch received by him from President Reyes and dated Bogota, January 18;

"Capital is declared in state of siege in order to judge conspirators with perfect calmness. Siege will be raised within a few days. Absolute tranquility prevails throughout the country."

The conspirators alluded to are Felipe Angelo and three others arrested last December for trying to overthrow the government of President Reyes. Their arrest was followed by considerable agitation in the capital and through out the country.

Consul-General Bonilla had this comment to make on the new plan:

"It was considered best by President Reyes, doubtless, to put the capital in a stage of siege-which means merely declaration of martial law-in order that the trial might not be disturbed in any way and that perfect justice be secured. There is no revolution in Colombia, The government is secure and the people content with President Reyes."
