PORTLAND MARKETS

Latest Quotations in the Portland Markets.

PORLAND, Jan. 26.—The price of grain bags has advanced to 8c, which is from 1-4c to 1-2c higher than last year. Scarcity of burlap at Calcutta, and signs of a heavy demand on the part of California wheatgrowers this year, combine to strengthen the market for both domestic and foreign bags.

"The bag market has not fairly opened yet, however," said a bag dealer today, "and the California wheat crop is likely to be much larger on paper than when threshing begins in July. Heavy rains have fallen recently in that State, but in the opinion of those best posted on the situation there the showers came too late to insure a good crop. It is conceded that if the grain has not sprouted well by January 1, there will be no heavy crop any season. The rains cease usually in March, and the grain attempts to ripen while but a few inches high. This condition favors a reduction in the price of grain bags before it is time for delivery of the bags to the grain producers of the Northwest."

Eggs remain firm, with a tendency to decrease, however, as the season has arrived when hens may be expected to commence laying. Big shipments will come in next week, which will send prices down several cents. Dealers say the demand for eggs was never greater at this time of year than now. Eastern eggs are not to the liking of buyers, who prefer the fresh Oregon article when they can get it.
