PORTLAND, Feb. 1.—Fancy creamery butter was firmer this morning on Front street and commission men found no difficulty in disposing of all that came in from the country. Eastern fresh butter has disappeared from this market on account of high prices at home, and cold storage stocks are pretty well worked off. This leaves the market entirely in the hands of local creameries, which must alone supply the demand.

Although butter and butter fat are high at this time, dairymen say they are making little or no money because milkstuffs command such high figures. Pastures, although very good for this time of the year, do not afford feed enough without the addition of bran, shorts or middlings, and these are dear at present.

Sheep are scarce and are expected to continue so until after shearing in the spring, when a good many wethers will be thrown upon the market.
