PORTLAND, Feb. 7.—Hogs have been so scarce and dear in Oregon that preparations are being made by dealers for importing them by the carload from Omaha and other packing centers East. Fear of bad weather en route has deterred dealers from ordering car lots of hogs in the winter, but in a few weeks more danger of blizzards will be pretty well past, and hogs can be brought out with very little risk.

"Pork has been scarce on the coast, on account of the high price of wheat," one livestock man reports. "Farmers could make more money selling their crops to millers and shippers than they could by feeding their wheat to hogs, and so the pork industry has suffered. The importation of Eastern hogs will not cause a drop in prices, however, as hogs are not over-numerous in the East. Pork will be more plentiful in Portland, but prices are likely to keep up."
