PORTLAND, Feb. 8.—Dressed mutton has never been so high in Portland at present, according to wholesale meat dealers, who do not see any sign of a decline for some time. In some case 9c and 9½c a pound has been paid for dressed carcasses, where a few months ago 5c was considered a fair price.

"Pork has been scarce on the coast, on account of the high price of wheat," one livestock man reports. "Farmers could make more money selling their crops to millers and shippers than they could by feeding their wheat to hogs, and so the pork industry has suffered. The importation of Eastern hogs will not cause a drop in prices, however, as hogs are not over-numerous in the East. Pork will be more plentiful in Portland, but prices are likely to keep up."
