TRADE RELATIONS

Germany-America Treaty Duties Will Be Opposed.

GERMANY DEPENDS ON U. S.

Prussian Minister of Commerce Says Germany is to Blame Because She Made no Trade Treaty With United States.

BERLIN, Feb. 20.—At the banquet last night of the Congress of German Chambers of Commerce, after a speech by Chancellor von Buelow, Dr. Delbruck, the Prussian minister of commerce and industry, discussed German trade relations with the United States. He said he anticipated that the provisional extension of treaty duties between the two countries will arouse much criticism, but he repelled the assertion that it was the fault of the German government that no treaty had been made. efficacy by the liners is not materially, if any, above 13 knots, the amendment gives the two Northern lines provided for a very convenient minimum margin, and will enable Portland and Puget Sound to use steamships of such tonnage and horse-power as they now have in the service. In the event that the subsidy measure become a law, this amendment will have important bearing on the Oriental commerce that the Oregon port is building up.

Holding up the Bristol nomination for the district attorneyship of Oregon has created far more interest in Washington than is usual with cases of equal rank. This peculiar prominence grows from the troubles through which the state has recently passed, which have been given national attention.

It is apparent in official circles that Oregon has gained wonderfully from the Bristol affair. This statement is without any prejudice to the young man in question, for his individuality is lost here in the more general aspect of the case as it bears on Oregon. Eastern people suddenly realize that the fine tooth comb process, when applied without fear or favor, is likely to catch some who have the very highest endorsement asked by the administration or Congress. Also, it is readily confessed that the fact of an endorsement being mistaken in its accuracy, is not a reflection upon the official responsible for the endorsement.

Briefly, the flower of any community, chosen with discrimination by persons who cannot possibly have local bias, may fall victims to charges, where the people are thoroughly aroused on the subject of pure administration.

When Senator Fulton made a public statement explaining how the obstruction to Bristol's confirmation came to his attention, the case was raised above party feeling. The Senate committee expressed the purpose of standing with the Oregon Senator, and equal acquiescence was shown by the administration

when the charge was presented to the President.

During discussion of the whipping post law for the District of Columbia, frequent reference was made to the Oregon statute, and many inquiries resulted. As Oregon is one of the newest states to adopt this form of punishment for wife-beaters, and is regarded typically Western, the legislators wanted to know how the new law affected both the public and the culprits. The mere fact that such a State as Oregon had the law, gave its consideration far more seriousness than would have been the case otherwise, but Oregon's prestige was not sufficient example to influence national legislators to the point of whipping wife-beaters at the Capitol.

took Orchard to Scott and Sterling, detectives of the mine owners' association and Orchard repeated his story. Scott and Sterling immediately employed him as a detective for the association. He was instructed to attend the meetings of the union and report daily. Orchard continued in the employ of the association until June, 1904. On June 6th an explosion occurred at the Independence depot and Orchard disappeared.

Hung Up By Thumbs.

A mob took possession of Cripple Creek and Victor and attempted to force a confession from many suspected parties. One young man was suspended by the thumbs until he agreed to tell the name of the fiend who caused the explosion. When lowered he said: "Harry Orchard did it."

Pursued By Bloodhounds.

Orchard was pursued by bloodhounds. The pursuing mob did not know Orchard was an employe of the mine-owners' association. It knew him only as a member of the miners' union. Orchard and a companion named Neville traveled by wagon out of Cripple Creek, avoiding important towns and finally reaching Greeley. There they took a train to Cheyenne, where Orchard received money from Colorado friends and disappeared. He returned to Denver last April. It is said he feared arrest on account of his connection with the explosion and therefore changed his name to Hogan. For a time he worked for insurance companies and August last left Colorado saying he was going to New York. He was next heard of when he was arrested for the Steunenberg murder. Neville was arrested, but the charge of murder was never pressed. Sheriff Bell claims Neville confessed that Orchard dynamited the depot. It is said Neville is now dead. This latter statement the Times has been unable to verify.

Statements Were True.

It is said Orchard's confession contained so many sensational statements that it was decided by the authorities to investigate before granting the extradition of Moyer, Heywood and Pettibone. It is said General Wells found the bomb intended for Judge Goddard of the Supreme Court at the exact spot where Orchard said it was.
