PORTLAND, Feb. 24.—Produce merchants report a brisk week for business on Front street. Receipts of fruits and vegetables from California, both by rail and sea, were heavy, prices stiff and the demand good. At this season the Northwest is mainly dependent on California for green vegetables, as the home gardeners do not raise enough of even the common varieties to tide over until new vegetables appear in the spring. The general prosperity of the country has expanded the demand for oranges and bananas in such a way as to keep consignments constantly on the road from Los Angeles and New Orleans. Shipments are disposed of soon after reaching the city, and collections have been more than ordinarily prompt.

Egg Prices Weak.
Fresh eggs were weak at 16¢ cents today and retailers only bought what they needed for the day's business, expecting a decline Monday. Receipts of fresh ranch eggs were heavy and the cases continued to pile up in the warehouses.
