PORTLAND, March 1.—Very few live chickens have reached the market this week, and prices of dressed poultry now are governed by the cold storage stocks just in from Omaha. What few live fowls were received have been bought up by Chinese, who seem willing to pay more for fowls which they can kill themselves. Scarcity of home-raised chickens is expected until after the laying season is over, when fat hens will probably be shipped in.

A scarcity of spring fryers and broilers has caused an advance in the prices offered for these classes of poultry, but dealers think stocks of this class have been cleaned up in the poultry yards of the Northwest for this season.

Apple playing Out.

Green apples become scarcer from day to day, and dealers say all stocks will have disappeared from this market in a few weeks more. Prices are higher than ever before known in Portland, although not so high as they are east.
