PORTLAND, March 3.—Very few live chickens have reached the market this week, and prices of dressed poultry now are governed by the cold storage stocks just in from Omaha. What few live fowls were received have been bought up by Chinese, who seem willing to pay more for fowls which they can kill themselves. Scarcity of home raised chickens is expected until after the laying season is over, when fat hens will probably be shipped in.

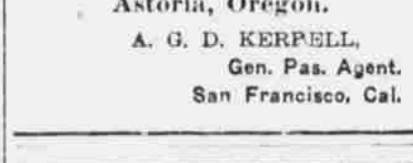
