

ANIMAL FOOD FOR HENS.

Merits of Green Cut and Ground Bone Compared.

Animal food should be given to hens as often as possible, fresh clean meat preferably; also green cut bone, says A. V. Meersch in Western Poultry Journal.

Green bone contains the natural juices and is not only soluble, but is food. It contains lime for the shell of the egg, nitrogen for the white, a proportion of oil and fat, and also serves as grit.

Ground bone becomes hard and brittle, has lost the natural solvent by evaporation, but green bone is readily dissolved when eaten and is also the most economical of all foods.

Profitable Geese.

Seeing how profitable geese are and the little attention they require as compared with other poultry, it is somewhat surprising there are not many more geese bred.
