Portland March 6. Some of the city creameries announce a decline of 24 cents a pound in the price of fancy creamery butter today. This drop is caused by the increasing supply of fresh cream and the threatening flooding of the Portland market with fancy creamery butter from California.

Fresh butter has been going up with us the past day or two. We have been getting in large quantities of cream, one from reports, and as we do not desire to hold butter long, we lower prices in order to work it off.
