Notice is hereby given, that the Common Council of the City of Astoria has declared its determination and intention to re-establish the grade on Irving avenue from east line of Twenty-fifth street to the west line of Twenty-eighth street, so that said grade when so re-established will be at the following elevation upon the basis of the grades as established by ordinance No. 71 of the City of Astoria, to-wit:

At the east line of Twenty-fifth street at 232 feet above the basis of grades; at the west line, and also the east line of Twenty-sixth street at 236 feet above the basis of grades; at the west line at Twenty-eighth street at 256 feet above basis of grades as now established.

Notice is hereby given, that the Common Council of the City of Astoria, has declared its intention and determination of constructing a sewer on Eighteenth street from a point of fifteen feet south of the north line of Grande avenue, to the north line of Exchange street.

From said point 15 feet south of the north line of Grande avenue, to the point at the south of the south line of Franklin avenue, the sewer shall be constructed of 18 inches iron extended sewer pipe laid 10 feet below the grade of the street, and from said point 50 feet south of the north line of Franklin avenue, to the north line of Exchange street, the sewer shall be constructed of a wooden box 12 inches by 14 inches inside measurement, and of three inch lumber, and shall be well fastened to the underpinning of the street.

In matters of detail, said sewer shall be constructed according to the plans and specifications therefore to be prepared by the City Surveyor.

That at said point 15 feet south of the north line of Grande avenue there shall be constructed a brick manhole into which the various cracks and box drains shall be lead. The costs and expenses of constructing said sewer shall be defrayed by special assessment upon the lot, lands and premises benefited by the same, which are described as follows:

lots 6, 7, 8 and 9 of block 13; lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 in block 14; lots 4, 5 and 6 in block 24; lots 1, 2, 3 and 4 of block 24; lots 6 and 7 of block 11; lots 1, 9, 10, 11 and 12 of block 112, all in that part of the town of Astoria (once city) as laid out and recorded by John M. Resolution introduced by Councilman being resolved by the Common Council of the City of Astoria, that said Council hereby declares its determination and intention to improve Bond street from the west line of Sixth street to the east line of McDowell street in that part of the City of Astoria, as laid out and recorded by John McClure and extended by Cyrus Olney.

Said improvement shall consist of removing all the old stangers, sidewalks and plank and grading the street to the established grade to the full width thereof, except the portion where wooden sidewalks are constructed, and at such places the street shall be graded from curb to curb to the established grade, or to the sub-grade so that when the street is improved it will be on the established grade. New sidewalks shall be constructed on both sides of the street and on the south side of the street from the west line of Fifth street to the west line of McClure's Astoria and on the north side of said street from the west line of Fourth street to the east line of Third street the sidewalks shall be cement sidewalks five feet wide and a two foot park space between the sidewalk and the curb and a park space of one foot between the inside edge of the sidewalk and the property line, and on the remaining portion of the street the sidewalks shall be wooden sidewalks constructed of decking two inches in thickness. Gutters shall be constructed on both sides of the street and catch basins connecting with sewers shall be constructed in each corner and all springs and seapages shall be taken up by tilting drains and lead into the gutters.

From curb to curb the street shall be macadamized or filled in with crushed rock to the depth of nine inches when thoroughly rolled and each layer of three inches shall be well rolled.

In matters of detail said improvement shall be constructed according to the plans and specifications therefore to be prepared by the City Surveyor as hereinafter provided.

That the costs and expenses of constructing said improvement shall be defrayed by special assessment upon the lots, lands and premises as follows, to-wit: lots 1, 2, 3 and 4 in each of blocks 17, 18, 19, 20, and 21, and lot-
