

Subtle Fluid to do the Most of Worlds' Work Henceforward.

NEW YORK, March, 11 Forty two illien dellars represents the advance made by the electrical industry had year. Figures instrompleted by New York experts prove that the greatest gain ever made came in 1905. In the previous year the gain was only ten per cents. East year an increase of from \$175,500,000 to \$217,000,000 - sows that the industry took a jump of twenty per sent.

The motor output increased \$7,000,000 in value. Telephone apparatus heat the record by half a million. Wire and cable manufacturers grined \$5,000,000. A still larger increase is shown in "misellaneous apparatus," which totals 825, 000,000. The only manufacturers who have stood still are the makers of electrical clocks. In the lighting field the gains have been enormous.

Trade authorities say that the indutry will continue its present rate of progress indefinitely.
