WASHINGTON, March 19 McCreary Bailey and Heyburn spoke on the railroad rate bill today. McCreary announced his intention to vote for the bill whether amended or not, but said he did not object to a reasonable provision for a court of review.

Bailey replied to the criticisms of his suggestion for a prohibition for the suspension of the commission's orders during the litigation. He contended that Congress had the power to prescribe the Matter of Building Astoria Seawall limitations for the courts, which it creates, and cited a large number of decisions in support of his contention.

Heyburn advocated the review feature, but expressed the opinion that even if it were omitted, no person could be deprived of his day in court
