Notice is hereby given that the common council of the city of Astoria, has declared its determination and intention to improve Fourth street from the north line of Astor street to the south rail on the railroad track of the Astoria & Columbia River R. R. Co., on Water street, to the full width thereof, and on the established grade thereof. Said improvement shall be made by grading the said street to the full width to the established grade and constructing sidewalks on both sides of said street, eight feet wide, by macadamizing or filling in said street with crushed rock from curb to curb, to the depth of 9 inches, on the sides, and 12 inches in center, and of course the grading of the street for the sub-grade from curb to curb, shall be 9 to 12 inches below the established grade, so that said street will be on said grade when filled in with said macadam, or crushed rock, and there shall be a crown in the center of the street of 12 inches.

In matters of detail said improvement shall be constructed according to the plans and specifications therefor to be prepared by the City Surveyor as hereinafter provided and general ordinance No. 1901 and any matter of construction and drainage found necessary to make the improvement safe or substantial shall be done by the contractor whether specified or not, without extra charge.

That City Surveyor be and he is hereby directed to make and file with the Auditor and Police Judge of the City of Astoria, plans and specifications for the construction of said improvement and estimates of the costs and expenses thereof.

That the Auditor and Police Judge of said city be and he is hereby directed to cause notice of the intention and determination of the Council to construct said improvement to be given by publication for eight days in the Morning Astorian.

That the costs and expenses of constructing said improvement shall be defrayed by special assessment upon the lots, lands and premises benefited by the same which said lots, lands and premises are included in the special assessment district including all lots, lands and premises so benefited to-wit:
