PORTLAND. March 26. Practically the only novelty in the local market today is a shipment of fancy ripe tomatoes and handsome Bell peppers, from Cuba. The first is selling at 8¢ a crate, and the latter readily commands 50¢ in the open market, as against 25¢/30¢ for other varieties. Fancy Mexican tomatoes at 82½¢ a crate, are also among the late arrivals in the vegetable line.

Three carloads bananas arrived this morning from California. The fruit is all green and will not be ready for the market for three or four weeks. In the meantime bananas are scarce.

The steamer Senator arrived this morning with a fresh shipment of cabbage and cauliflower, but it was in a badly damaged condition. Cabbage is scarce and in good demand at \$1.00/82½¢ a crate, and there is a prospect of famine in cauliflower. The orange market remains firm at \$1.25, with plenty of stock on hand.

All vegetables from California are more or less damaged, owing to the inclemency of the weather at the shipping and packing points. New potatoes are selling at 6¢; artichokes, \$1.25 a dozen; parsley, 20¢; radishes, 30¢; asparagus, 10¢/30¢; heavy receipts, \$1.25.
