PORTLAND, April 17.—The demands on front street produce and fresh meat dealers continue to be in excess of supplies. California is drawn upon for about every sort of marketable product, but some of the staples are about as hard to get in San Francisco as they are in Oregon. Cabbage is practically scarce in San Francisco, and Southern California has been drawn upon to tide over until the Oregon product matures; price is firm at \$2.50 per 100 pounds. There is a great scarcity of hothouse products, and the market is ready to take everything offered in the green truck line.
