PORTLAND—The horror of the calamity that has overtaken San Francisco prevails every branch of business in Portland. In consequence of that feeling, local trade conditions are not much thought of. A great wave of sympathy for the people of the people of the Southern city who have been rendered homeless takes the place of deals and trading for mere personal gain. Front street was called upon by the supply committee of the commercial bodies to furnish large quantities of onions, crackers and bread went with the first relief train last night.

Stocks of such supplies as were called upon in the emergency were of rather larger proportions, so that the unusual demand was promptly met. The call could be duplicated if required, without seriously impairing purely local necessities.
