Anyone with anything to give in the way of clothing, blankets or anything that will be of use and comfort, are requested to deliver the same promptly at that place.

On friday morn ing, at five minutes notice, they had to vacate their home, and turn it over to the dynamiters, who blew it up in their efforts to stay the advancing flames.
