To the Honorable County Court of Clatsop County:

Gentlemen :-- I hereby request that you furnish an office for me as county and district attorney for the year 1906, or that in lieu of same you allow me the sum of \$25 per month for the expense of the office which I have at present.

You are undoubtedly aware that the law says that the district attorney is the officer of the county, also that the county court has power to provide offices and furniture, books, stationery, fuel and light therefor for the county officers.

I have never heretofore asked the court to provide for any portion of the expense of my office, on account of the increased work for the county during the past year, I am compelled to hire extra help.

Therefore, I have determined to request only what the law clearly en titles me to, that is the appropriation of the sum mentioned above.
