PORTLAND, May 14.—There are more potatoes piled up on the wharves than at any time for months. From Narrow Gauge to Ash street there are estimated to be between 4500 and 5000 sacks, mostly commission goods.

A leading front-street firm this morning received the following dispatch, which indicates the condition at San Francisco.

"Don't ship any potatoes to this market. Absolutely no sales."

New potatoes are weaker than last week's quotations, and arrivals from California are fully equal to the demands of this market.
