PORTLAND, May 30.—Front street had a Sunday appearance by noon today, commission men and wholesalers generally locking up their places of business in observance of the holiday.

Some crops of poultry were held over as the offered price was much under what dealers consider a fair figure, though tomorrow's receipts may be heavy enough to bring about another drop. The general tone is weak.

Butter Higher.

Formal announcement of an advance in city creamery butter, usual at this time of year, will be made tomorrow to the trade.

The quotations is moved up from 20c to 21 1/2c for extra creamery, and other grades will be advanced in proportion.

Poultry.

The tone of the poultry market is decidedly weak. Nearly every dealer talks lower prices, and the prospect is for continued full receipts.

Eggs are steady at quotations, 19c to 20c, with most sales reported at 19 1/2c.

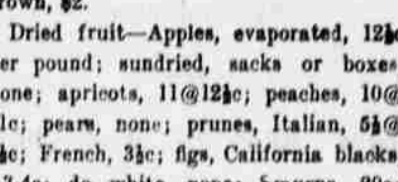
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
