PORTLAND, June 2 .- Poultry was in heavy supply and in the clean-up yes terday as low as 11 cents was named by dealers as best. Young ducks are also coming in very freely and price has dropped off.

Butter and Eggs.

Among produce dealers the advance of city creamery to 214 cents was made by the house announcing the rise on account of the increased manufacture of ice cream. The creamery has a very large and widely extended market for the frozen product, and at this season naturally the output is increased.

Other grades of butter, so far, have not been affected by the advance, and there are no indications that they will be very soon. Store butter is in very heavy receipt and country creamery also comes in in excess of requirements,

Eggs at 19 to 19h cents find quite an active demand and receipts, while heavy. are not top heavy. The 20-cent quotation was not mentioned this morning as obtained in any instance.


